

Code of Conduct for Parents

As a parent of a player associated with Knutsford Rugby Club, Mini & Junior Section, you have a responsibility to maintain the family orientated ethos that we aspire to by ensuring that all young players enjoy the game of rugby. This involves assisting in developing skills and potential, and building effective and successful rugby teams through the promotion of all young players' enjoyment of the game. To help us achieve these objectives please observe your responsibilities to the Club and to your child as outlined in this simple Code of Conduct.

BE POSITIVE

Please encourage but never force an unwilling child to play rugby or push them towards a level they are not capable of achieving. Speak to the coach if you are uncertain. As a spectator, you represent Knutsford Rugby Club and it is by your actions and attitude that our club will be judged.

Try to set a good example on the touchline. Applaud good play by both sides. Be proud – not loud!

BE SAFE

If you have any concerns at all about your child's participation in the club then speak to the lead coach in the first instance or contact the Welfare Officer.

There is an expectation you or a nominated guardian will be present when your child is playing or training.

Please ensure your child is properly equipped to play rugby.
